AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to prohibiting co-payments for treatment at an opioid treatment program

<The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assem-

<bly, do enact as follows:>

1- 1 Section 1. Subsection (i) of section 3216 of the insurance law is 1- 2 amended by adding a new paragraph 31-b to read as follows:

<(31-b) Every policy that provides coverage for treatment at an opioid> <treatment program shall not impose a co-payment fee during the course of> <treatment on any insured for such treatment. For the purposes of this> <section "opioid treatment program" means a program or practitioner> <engaged in opioid treatment of individuals with an opioid agonist treat-> <ment medication.>

1- 9 § 2. Subsection (1) of section 3221 of the insurance law is amended by 1-10 adding a new paragraph 7-b to read as follows:

<(7-b) Every policy that provides coverage for treatment at an opioid> <treatment program shall not impose a co-payment fee during the course of> <treatment on any insured for such treatment. For the purposes of this> <section "opioid treatment program" means a program or practitioner> <engaged in opioid treatment of individuals with an opioid agonist treat-> <ment medication.>

Section 4303 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new subsection (1-2) to read as follows:

<(1-2) Every policy that provides coverage for treatment at an opioid> 1-19 <treatment program shall not impose a co-payment fee during the course of> 1-20 1-21 <treatment on any insured for such treatment. For the purposes of this> 1-22 <section "opioid treatment program" means a program or practitioner>
